 Promise Health Plan Updates Dr. Susan Fleischman reported on the following: Shared COVID-19 updates. COVID-19 continues to be a hot spot particularly in Los Angeles. There are 75,000 reported cases in Los Angeles and 3,000 deaths. Shared outreach efforts such as calling to remind members of annual exams and immunizations for children have been suspended but looking to relaunch outreach in July. The plan will align with the State of California to move forward with certain age groups. Children 0-2 will be first age group to come in for warranted immunizations.  <u>Ouestions:</u> BSCPHP is ready to launch outreach efforts but are the members ready to come in? Do you feel safe going in and can you get access to care? Victoria – I know a lot of people getting infected is the Latino community. What are we doing to help decrease the spread of COVID-19? BSCPHP is working with high risk members and doing outreach. Also, all chief medicals are working with the county of public health to make sure that the testing sites are in the right neighborhood. In addition, safety measures are being implemented in the workforce. <u>Comments:</u> Margie – I can see the children getting immunization but when it comes to older adults my fear is getting exposed. Many older adults do not want to go to the hospital or clinics because they do not feel safe. Telehealth is a good way to go. Robert – Been getting good care from my doctor via telehealth. Heriberto – Great communication with my doctor via telehealth, positive experience. Elizabeth- My experience is wonderful; telehealth is working great! 		



• Reported state budget and program cuts due to the impact of COVID- 19. There is less tax revenue from many losing their jobs and becoming unemployed therefore, less funding to support programs. There was a \$2 billion within Medi-Cal. Many proposals were withdrawal that include indefinitely delays in "Cal Aim" Medi-Cal reform initiative, expansion of full-scope Medi-Cal to undocumented seniors, Medi-Cal managed are rates, and reduce Medi-Cal benefits and provider payments. However, the senate and assembly passed their joint counterproposal to Governor's May revision to restore some cutes and reverse Governor's "federal trigger".		
 <u>Comments:</u> Margie – Cutbacks are also impacting mental health facilities. 		
 L.A. Care/Blue Shield Promise Community Resource Centers Thomas reported on the following: Shared CRC Updates. All centers have been closed since March but remain present in the community through the partnership with Pomona Fairplex and Sowing Seeds. L.A. Care and BSCPHP contributed care packages and meals to approximately 2,000 families per event. In addition, L.A. Care and BSCP CRC has developed a virtual program that provides health classes and nutrition courses to the public via the CRC YouTube page. We have received over 400 subscribers. Launched a CRC E-Newsletter in May and was sent to our members, partners, and providers.  <u>Questions:</u> Greg – is the construction continue during this time for the rest of CRC? Construction is on going but has been delayed. We are looking at 3 additional locations that will be completed sometime in August. <u>Comments:</u> Robert- Would like to go visit the Resource Centers once we go back to normal and open. I would also like to suggest that BSCPHP sponsor little leagues to market CRCs and spread awareness.

 Reported the numbers have been lower since the spread of COVID-19. In Q2 there were 46 CCI cases and no reported BSC cases. Some trending issues reported are increases in medical debt and medical denials and appeals. Jackie shared updates on testing, treatment, and medical redetermination. If received redetermination notice the county must keep the Medi-Cal account active during the pandemic regardless if application was submitted. She also discussed immigration statues and public charge during COVID-19. There was higher Medi-Cal disenrollment in Q1.
