<ul> <li>Over 5 million Californians have applied for unemployment assistant.</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li>State faces lower tax revenue, deficits over \$50 billion (over 1/3<sup>rd</sup> total spending).</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li>State must cut spending and/or increase taxes to balance the budget</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li>California will ensure nobody will lose their Medi-Cal benefits during COVID-19</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li>Governor &amp; Legislature reached agreement to balance the budget</li> <li>Expected to sign by the end of June</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li>BSCPHP has been preparing for the 1.5% retroactive cut for 7/1/19- 12/31/20</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>In response to COVID-19, Blue Shield Promise partnered with San Diego County supervisor Fletcher to invest \$50,000 in the Community Impact Fund.</li> <li>Partnered with CBOs in San Diego to assist with food distributions.</li> <li>Held food distribution in Spring Valley in partnership with MAAC and served 550 families.</li> <li>Hosting food distribution in Ocean side, serving about 250 families and Chula Vista, serving 570 families.</li> <li>Donated \$100,000 to support food insecurities</li> </ul>	Rogers	Distributions events with Araceli to share with the committee.

<ul> <li>Population Needs Assessment (PNA) requires Medi-Cal Plans to implement a PNA.</li> <li>PNA will help us identify health differences (disparities) among groups of people.</li> <li><u>Questions:</u></li> <li>What do you think are important health concerns or issues for people living in your area?</li> <li>What can we do to support these issues?</li> <li>In the past we have offered in-person classes, and we hope to offer in person classes again in the future. In addition to in-person classes, we will be offering virtual classes. What is your interest in virtual classes?</li> <li>Ruth – Do you already have a program that caters to people who are not tech-savvy.</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>Member- We lack nutritional, health, and exercise classes in El Cajon. Grocery stores are not as close. It takes me 45 minutes to walk to groceries stores. Prefer in-person classes but virtual classes would be wonderful if I can attend and view them through my smart phone.</li> <li>Community Based Organization - A health concern we are paying closer attention to and screening is substance abuse. There has been an increase in alcohol consumption since the stay-at-home order. Also,</li> </ul>		

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<ul> <li>people with chronic pain issues have become less active. Need more information to help folks manage chronic pain symptoms and become more active during this time.</li> <li>Member – I prefer in-person conversation but with the current situation virtual is best.</li> <li>Member– BSCPHP might need to consider creating courses that will teach people how to use virtual technology, smartphones, and download apps.</li> <li>BSCPHP Staff – Our social service team is available to help connect members to resources.</li> </ul>
