State Budget Updates		
 Over 5 million Californians have applied for unemployment assistant. 		
 State faces lower tax revenue, deficits over \$50 billion (over 1/3rd total spending). 		
 State must cut spending and/or increase taxes to balance the budget 		
 California will ensure nobody will lose their Medi-Cal benefits during COVID-19 		
 Governor & Legislature reached agreement to balance the budget Expected to sign by the end of June 		
 BSCPHP has been preparing for the 1.5% retroactive cut for 7/1/19- 12/31/20

 In response to COVID-19, Blue Shield Promise partnered with San Diego County supervisor Fletcher to invest \$50,000 in the Community Impact Fund. Partnered with CBOs in San Diego to assist with food distributions. Held food distribution in Spring Valley in partnership with MAAC and served 550 families. Hosting food distribution in Ocean side, serving about 250 families and Chula Vista, serving 570 families.  Population Needs Assessment (PNA) requires Medi-Cal Plans to implement a PNA. PNA will help us identify health differences (disparities) among groups of people. <u>Questions:</u> What do you think are important health concerns or issues for people living in your area? What can we do to support these issues? In the past we have offered in-person classes, and we hope to offer in person classes again in the future. In addition to in-person classes, we will be offering virtual classes. What is your interest in virtual classes? Ruth – Do you already have a program that caters to people who are not tech-savvy.

 Member- We lack nutritional, health, and exercise classes in El Cajon. Grocery stores are not as close. It takes me 45 minutes to walk to groceries stores. Prefer in-person classes but virtual classes would be wonderful if I can attend and view them through my smart phone. Community Based Organization - A health concern we are paying closer attention to and screening is substance abuse. There has been an increase in alcohol consumption since the stay-at-home order.
